1. Quality Jobs

The current labor shortage can be only addressed by better and quality jobs for young people. The correlation between poor working conditions (pay, stability, health & safety and work-life balance) and the lack of workers in certain sectors and certain areas of Europe is self-explanatory.

We must debunk the narrative about young people's passion for job-hopping. The opposite is true: Young workers value stability and do not deserve to be victims of the continuous liberalization of the labor market that continues

to bring new forms of precarious work and new business models that are based on violation of workers' rights.

To this end, young people must be educated through the public system about their workers' rights as well as the social security system and safety they are entitled to in their country if they decide to go work abroad.

2. TAX THE RICH AND STOP AUSTERITY

We see public services like healthcare, schools and public transport crumbling in front of our eyes. We have to urgently stop the trend of privatization of those services and inject money into staff and infrastructure.

Quality social services and just transition are not for free and we need to keep investing although the return on investment is not always coming back only in numbers. It is our society and planet that we fight for.

The ongoing wars result in unacceptable human suffering and the loss of human lives. Here in the EU, neo-liberalism and corporate greed transformed them in the cost of living crisis, loss of jobs, housing and the ability of many to pay for heating and warm meals. For banks and multinationals, however, the profits were never bigger.

We ask to stop this nonsense and bring money and investments where they are needed by the majority of the population.



3. BAN UNPAID TRAINEESHIPS!

Stop the exploitation of young people.

Unpaid internships are a discriminatory practice that only a few can afford and undertake in the framework of an unfamous race to the bottom. For a long time trainees have been used as cheap and unpaid labour, replacing entry-level jobs and instead of a healthy start to their career, they enter the spiral of precariousness.

In the ongoing shortage of skills there is no excuse to pay qualified young professionals less with the empty excuse that they lack working experience. If the employer hires a trainee they need to be ready to assign a mentor and set the learning objectives of the traineeship, register their contract, pay social security contributions and pay an adequate salary.

Guarantee affordable housing.

A stable housing situation is crucial for a decent life and is often a precondition for successful take-up of employment opportunities. However, access to affordable housing is often denied to young people who are being priced out of the city housing market and are increasingly distanced from home ownership.

We have to establish a clear priority:

public housing and stability before short-term tourist housing must be
the guiding principle of all national and local governments.

Invest in public housing and regulation of the rental market by limiting the maximum rental price and encouraging housing as good for use, not as an investment/speculation.



CLIMATE JUSTICE AND JUST TRANSITION NOW!

Failure to mitigate climate change and failure to address climate change adaptation credibly are not only two severe risks but also concerns of our generation. We see natural disasters, extreme weather events, biodiversity loss ecosystem collapse being dealt with in a reactionary manner instead of introducing bold measures to prevent them.

Expected involuntary migration due to weather conditions seems like a nightmare in the situation when Europe is shamefully not able to find a consensus on how to welcome and integrate migrants and refugees escaping terror and war.

The true price and impact on the next generation must be visibly considered.

Stop subsidies for fossil fuels and invest in renewable energy and vocational training to make a social and ecological transformation of the economy possible. Green quality jobs must be at the heart of just transition.
